

Subjects and Predicates: Practice Sheet

*A sentence is a group of words that expresses a **complete thought**.*

Every sentence is made up of at least **two parts**:

1. A **subject** (**someone** or **something**)

Example: Most birds can fly.

2. A **predicate** (what the someone or something is **being** or **doing**)

Example: Most birds can fly.
